Contract for Lakewood Subdivision and Sounder Everett Yard Maintenance of Way

Proposed action

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a seven-year contract, with two one-year options to extend, with Stacy and Witbeck, Inc. to provide track, signal, and bridge maintenance services for Sound Transit's Lakewood Subdivision and Sounder Everett Yard right-of-way for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$35,572,574 plus applicable taxes.

Key features summary

- This contract will provide the required track, signal, and bridge maintenance for Sound Transit's right of way from Tacoma-to-Nisqually as well as Everett and Lakewood layover yards.
- The Federal Railway Administration (FRA) has progressively higher regulatory standards for track
 maintenance depending on the speed of the trains operating on the track. The scope of this contract
 will fulfill FRA requirements for higher-speed passenger train operations.
- This contract will provide:
 - Track, signal, and bridge maintenance for the Sound Transit-owned line
 - Layover yard and wayside power maintenance
 - o Positive Train Control (PTC) wayside equipment maintenance
 - Required FRA inspections
 - Geometry car ride-quality checks to detect and correct surface deviations
 - Track resurfacing (realignment and re-ballasting)
 - Graffiti/Vandalism removal within 24 hours
 - Inspection and repairs for unanticipated maintenance needs
 - Vegetation control and tree removal
 - Flagging for third party contractors working in/near the ROW
 - Emergency response services as required
- The requested amount covers all seven years and the two one-year options under the contract.
- Applicable taxes are currently estimated to be \$3,592,830.

Background

Sound Transit purchased the Tacoma-to-Nisqually railroad line from BNSF in 2003. The line required infrastructure improvements to accommodate Sounder commuter, WSDOT, and Amtrak intercity operations. The Tacoma-to-Nisqually line is 20 miles long and includes three stations: the Tacoma Dome, South Tacoma, and Lakewood Sounder stations. The scope of work under this contract requires five full-time and four part-time technical specialists, with provisions for any emergency and on-call work that may be needed. A portion of the maintenance expense for the Lakewood to Nisqually segment is offset by agreements with Amtrak, Tacoma Rail, and BNSF.

Procurement information

Sound Transit issued a Request for Proposals on April 10, 2024. Sound Transit determined a best-value method was appropriate for this procurement due to the potential need to conduct negotiations and evaluate factors other than price as basis for award, such as: knowledge and experience of key individuals, firm(s) experience and history, capacity and project approach, and Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) commitment. Sound Transit received three proposals in response to the solicitation. The awardee received a total score of 983/1000 points. The proposed price of \$35,572,573.58 (before tax) is fair and reasonable based on comparison of the competitive market rates submitted by other offerors. The proposed price is also less than the independent cost estimate of \$65,443,481.82 for the full term, i.e., base plus all option periods.

Fiscal information

This action for \$39,165,404 including estimated applicable taxes, will be funded from the Operations Department's annual operating budget. Within the Services category, the Contract Maintenance budget is \$19,860,809, of which \$652,755 is estimated to be spent from this contract in the remainder of 2024 and is currently within the agency's budget authority. After approval of this action, sufficient budget remains to cover remaining annual expenditures; funding for the additional years of the contract will be included in future annual budget requests.

This action does not impact the affordability of the agency's Financial Plan, as the services are already incorporated in the annual operating plan.
