Ms. Sullivan expressed concern that Transit Oriented Development and Economic Development were not fully reflected in the budget. Those items may need to be added.

Draft Operating Budget

Ms. Hendrickson reviewed the 1998 Budget Introduction and the Operating Budget and Staffing Plan (copies on file). She pointed out that capital budget adoption by the board does not provide staff authorization to proceed on individual projects. Each project falls under the guidelines of Resolution No.78, which establishes delegated authority and procedures for the procurement of materials, work and services and for the acquisition and use of property and property rights for the Authority.

Committee members discussed capitalization of costs. Mr. Miller asked why Government Relations costs were not capitalized.

Ms. Hendrickson explained that federal guidelines prohibit the capitalization of those costs. She indicated she would report back to the committee if those costs could be allocated to other departments without capitalizing them.

Committee members discussed the difficulty of explaining the use of Year of Expenditure dollars to the public.
