OBJECTIVE OF ACTION

 To enter into an "umbrella" agreement with the University of Washington so that the University can provide assistance to support the completion of environmental and engineering analyses of North Link routes potentially affecting the University.

ACTION

• Authorize the Executive Director to execute an agreement with the University of Washington to provide environmental and design assistance for the North Link SEIS project in the amount of \$250,000 plus a 10% contingency of \$25,000 for a total authorized amount not to exceed \$275,000. The agreement provides services through December 2003.

KEY FEATURES

- The University's assistance would be for portions of North Link routes potentially affecting University of Washington facilities. The umbrella agreement includes:
 - General scope of services including providing facilities and utilities data, evaluation of vibration and other technical analyses, and assistance in determining cost effective mitigation measures.
 - Agreement administrative procedures and project control requirements.
 - Task order process to authorize specific work.
- Includes authorization for the Executive Director to execute multiple task orders within the authorized amount to the umbrella agreement for specific assistance for North Link. Each task order will include:

- Specific services and work products for the conceptual engineering/Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) phase and the preliminary engineering/Final SEIS phase of the North Link Study.
- Scope, schedule and budget for each task order.
- The term of the agreement is through the duration of the North Link Study ending in December 2003.

BUDGET DISCUSSION

The total budget for North Link is \$110 million, which includes approximately \$89 million of previous expenditures. Within the budget, the activity contemplated within this motion is identified within the Third Party Agreements phase.

This activity was included within the cost estimate and there are sufficient funds identified for work identified in this motion. In North Link the budget for all third party agreements is \$2,030,000 and with this action together with previous actions, there is a remaining budget of \$1,487,000 for this phase. With the award of this contract, there is sufficient budget remaining to complete the project.

REVENUE, SUBAREA, AND FINANCIAL PLAN IMPACTS

The proposed action is consistent with the current board adopted budget and is affordable within the agency's current long-term financial plan and subarea financial capacity. The action will have no new revenue impacts on Sound Transit.
