OBJECTIVE OF ACTION

• Approval to execute options to extend the term of the existing contract (No. RTA/RE 04-01) with Roy F. Weston for on-call Geographic Information Systems (GIS) services.

ACTION

 Authorizes the Executive Director to execute options to extend the term of the existing contract (No. RTA/RE 04-01) with Roy F. Weston for on-call Geographic Information Systems (GIS) services for an additional two years and at a cost not to exceed \$408,262 for a new authorized total contract amount of \$597,394.

KEY FEATURES

- Authorizes the Executive Director to execute options to extend the term of the existing contract with Roy F. Weston for on-call GIS services by adding \$408,262 for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$597,394.
- This action will continue agency-wide GIS mapping, application development and analysis services for the remaining two years of an existing contract through June 6, 2004.

Project needs currently identified by Sound Transit service lines and corporate departments under this on-call contract through June 6, 2004, are as follows:

- Real Estate: Real Property asset management and acquisition analysis \$50,000.
- Link Light Rail: North Link EIS analysis and Civil Engineering ROW mapping support for the Initial Segment \$120,000.

• Planning and Development Division: System management and Phase II mapping and analysis \$238,262.

The proposed amendment will provide sufficient resources for Sound Transit service lines of business to complete their GIS technical work in an effective manner over the course of 2002 - 2004. It is especially desirable to maintain resources in the existing contract to support Link and Real Estate needs through the next two years in support of the North Link EIS and property acquisition on the Central Line.

The first year budget and option for a two-year extension was set as such to allow for an evaluation at the end of the first contract year based on year one budget. This has allowed staff to review the budget estimates for the first year and the tasks completed in order to formulate a more accurate budget estimate for the option of years two and three.

M/W/DBE - SMALL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION

Roy F. Weston committed to 18% M/W/DBE participation on this contract. Weston was able to achieve 17% due to one of the firms going out of business before it was able to perform. The M/W/DBE participation for this amendment is projected at a minimum of 18%, and efforts will be made to meet an overall total of 18%.

HISTORY OF PROJECT

Among the functions of the Sound Transit Policy and Planning Office is the administration of long-range (future phase) planning, fare integration, research and technology, and contract technical assistance activities for all three lines of business: Link Light Rail, Commuter Rail, and Regional Express. The on-call Geographic Information Systems (GIS) services for GIS technical needs is managed by this office.

In January 2001, the Office of Policy and Planning released a competitive RFP for consultant GIS services providing both in-house support and on-call services. Roy F. Weston was awarded this contract in the amount of \$189,132 for a term of one year with an option for two additional years. This action would increase the budget amount to accommodate the two additional years on the contract. At the end of this two-year period, staff would re-assess the Agency needs and, if needed, release a new competitive RFP.

Geographic Information Systems (GIS) is a cross-disciplinary technology that combines the data capacity of databases with the ability to display that information graphically with maps. Sound Transit has made considerable investment and progress with a GIS that was created during the conceptual engineering phase of Link.

With many miles of light rail in the Central Corridor spread over three municipalities (Seattle, Tukwila, and SeaTac), GIS developed geographically accurate rail alignment maps for each of the geographic segments during the EIS process to help communicate the issues to the public as well as help control and document the projects evolution.

The analysis effort for the EIS furthered the GIS by developing applications and datasets that have been leveraged into other lines of business and corporate departments. This has allowed departments and divisions other than Link to use existing spatial data sets in combination with their own databases for project development and planning needs. For example, the Real Estate division has created an application using the existing spatial data to track property acquisitions and process status which allows them to view their division's acquisition data spatially.

GIS has enhanced Link Project Development's ability to perform a broad array of analyses for both the draft EIS and the final EIS that have been presented to the public and the FTA. GIS continues to aid the Civil Engineering and Right of Way teams in their assessment of the impacts of the various alignment alternatives to land parcels and buildings. This type of use of the GIS has received favorable comments by the FTA during quarterly reviews.
