OBJECTIVE OF ACTION

 Amend the contract with E. I. Kosty & Associates, Ltd. to secure additional time to lead the completion of four Sounder Commuter Rail capital projects: Phases I and II BNSF Track and Signal Improvements; Tacoma Dome Station; Reservation to Freighthouse Square Connection; and Median Safety Improvements.

ACTION

Authorizing the Executive Director to execute a contract amendment with E. I. Kosty &
Associates, Ltd. for additional engineering consulting services for Sounder Commuter Rail
projects by adding \$451,000 to the current contract amount of \$515,000 for a new total
authorized contract amount not to exceed \$966,000, and by extending the contract through
March 23, 2005.

KEY FEATURES

- This amendment would extend the contract for two years to utilize E. I. Kosty & Associates, Ltd.'s engineering consulting services as senior project manager on four Sounder capital projects with a September 2003 deadline: Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) Track and Signal Improvements to allow Sounder Phase I level of service; Tacoma Dome Station; Reservation to Freighthouse Square Connection; and Median Safety Improvements.
- This work would expedite the completion of the remaining capital projects under the Interim Operating Agreement for the Tacoma-to-Seattle corridor, which expires in September 2003.
- The contract amendment allows E. I. Kosty & Associates, Ltd. to provide project oversight of Sounder Phase II BNSF Track and Signal Improvements (extending beyond September 2003). Completion of Sounder Phase II will enable Sounder trains to reach full level of service to nine trains per day.

BUDGET DISCUSSION

The total Adopted 2003 Budget of \$185 million represents the combined construction phase of two projects: Seattle-to-Auburn Track and Signals (110), and Tacoma Dome Station (245). The activities considered within this motion are split evenly between the construction phases of these two projects. These project budgets contain sufficient funds for this effort and committing these funds does not endanger any other project elements that are to be funded out of the overall project.

REVENUE, SUBAREA, AND FINANCIAL PLAN IMPACTS

The proposed action is consistent with the current Board-adopted budget and is affordable within Sound Transit's current long-term financial plan and the subarea financial capacity.

M/W/DBE - SMALL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION

The original RFQ encouraged M/W/DBE participation. E.I. Kosty and Associates, Ltd. is a sole proprietorship small business and has performed 100% of the work on this contract. E.I. Kosty and Associates, Ltd. will perform 100% of the work on the amended contract.

HISTORY OF PROJECT

^{*} The final design phase (Line 4) depicts an over committed budget of \$579,000. These costs have not yet been incurred, however, staff have forecasted these costs as a future commitment. Consistent with Sound Transit Board approved budget policy, this future commitment will be depicted as a negative variance until the 2004 budget is adopted, when unallocated contingency can be reallocated to the final design phase.

In February 2000, a Request for Qualifications for an Engineering and Operations Consultant for Sounder Operational Segments was advertised. In March 2000, E.I. Kosty & Associates, Ltd. was awarded the contract for a total authorized amount of \$195,000.

The scope of work covered under the original contract included E. I. Kosty & Associates. Ltd. participation in:

- design, development, and management of Sounder Stations' facilities and supporting systems;
- management of the civil construction performed by Sound Transit's contractors;
- · contract management oversight for the design of Sounder systems and facilities; and
- design, development, construction and operation of yard facilities, and track and signal systems that support the Sounder program, including working in partnership with BNSF and other railroads.

Motion No. M2001-55 amended the contract to include negotiations with BNSF, track and field configuration in consultation with BNSF and Tacoma Rail (on the Lakewood-to-Tacoma segment), and civil engineering and operations expertise on all segments. The amendment added \$320,000 to the original contract amount of \$195,000, for a new total authorized amount of \$515,000. The Motion was approved June 7, 2001 by the Sound Transit Board, and the amended contract expires March 23, 2003.

This amendment authorizes a contract extension of two years to ensure continuity to complete four Sounder capital projects with a September 2003 deadline. The projects are BNSF Track and Signal Improvements to allow for the implementation of Sounder Phase I service; Tacoma Dome Station; Reservation to Freighthouse Square Connection; and Median Safety Improvements. E. I. Kosty & Associates, Ltd. would serve as senior project manager on these projects. E. I. Kosty & Associates, Ltd. would also be assigned project oversight of Sounder Phase II BNSF Track and Signal Improvements (extending beyond September 2003). Completion of Sounder Phase II will enable Sounder trains to reach full level of service to nine trains per day.
