OBJECTIVE OF ACTION

To provide additional funds to exercise remaining optional years for a professional services contract with Cocker Fennessy, Inc.

ACTION

Authorizes the Chief Executive Officer to execute a contract amendment with Cocker Fennessy, Inc. to continue to provide strategic communications planning, community relations and public affairs assistance for 2004 and the remaining optional years, in the amount of \$450,000, for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$625,000.

KEY FEATURES

- The scope of this contract includes strategic communications planning, community relations, and public affairs assistance.
- Provides the agency with strategic planning and coordination in promotion of the agency's interests.
- Authorizes an additional \$450,000 to fund the current Second Option year and future Third and Fourth Option years, and authorizes the discretion to execute the Third Option (fourth year) and Fourth Option (fifth year) of the contract to extend the contract to December 31, 2005, and December 31, 2006, respectively.
- Although the total contract amount is authorized by the Board, future options will not be exercised unless the Chief Executive Officer is satisfied with the contractor's performance in the previous option year.

BUDGET IMPACT SUMMARY

There is no action outside of the Board-adopted budget; there are no contingency funds required, no subarea impacts, or funding required from other parties other than what is already assumed in the financial plan.

BUDGET DISCUSSION

The expenditures anticipated under the terms of this contract amendment cover multiple years. The Adopted 2004 Budget would cover estimated costs of \$150,000. The remaining \$300,000 will be included in future years' staff budgets

REVENUE, SUBAREA, AND FINANCIAL PLAN IMPACTS

The proposed action is consistent with the current Board-adopted budget and is affordable within Sound Transit's current long-term financial plan and the subarea financial capacity.

Cocker Fennessy is the prime consultant for this contract. Cocker Fennessy is a small business, therefore 100 percent of the contract will be performed by a small business.

EEO Profile

Cocker Fennessy's total workforce is seven people. Four are female, with no persons of color.

HISTORY OF PROJECT

In 2002, Sound Transit conducted a competitive procurement process to select a firm to provide strategic consulting services to the agency. Cocker Fennessy was selected as a result of that competitive process, which provided for an annual contract and options for four, one-year extensions.

The contract was awarded for the period from April 2002 through December 31, 2002, for \$175,000. Contract options were exercised for two additional one-year periods, which extended the contract through December 31, 2004. There are two remaining options which would extend the contract through December 31, 2006. No additional funds were provided during those contract extensions. The original funds are almost depleted.

CONSEQUENCES OF DELAY

Cocker Fennessy Inc. has a current contract with Sound Transit and is satisfactorily performing the scope of work. A delay or denial of this action by the Finance Committee may result in a disruption of work flow that could be detrimental to the strategic communication goals of Sound Transit and the on-going community involvement and agency efforts to inform the public about the agency's activities.
