# **ACTION**

Authorize the Chief Executive Officer to execute a contract with Gillig Corporation for the manufacture and delivery of two standard floor 40-foot diesel buses for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$679.488.

### **KEY FEATURES**

- The contract award using the piggyback option to the Community Transit's contract number 03-02 executed in 2003 with the Gillig Corporation.
- Equipped with passenger amenities including recliner seats, air-conditioning, parcel racks with integrated reading lamps and American Disability Act (ADA) approved wheel chair lifts. The contract also includes fare-boxes and training.
- Equipped with low emission Cummins diesel engines.
- Community Transit will operate the buses which, will be assigned to Snohomish County routes.
- This contract meets the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) procurement guidelines in the event FTA grant funding becomes available.

# **BUDGET IMPACT SUMMARY**

There is no action outside of the Board-adopted budget; there are no contingency funds required; there are no subarea impacts or funding required from other parties other than what is already assumed in the financial plan.

# **BUDGET DISCUSSION**

The Adopted 2004 Budget includes the Bus Systemwide acquisition program (project #290). This program has a lifetime budget of \$105.7 million, of which a total of \$84.5 million has been committed. Following this purchase, a total of \$20.5 million will remain in the program.

# REVENUE, SUBAREA, AND FINANCIAL PLAN IMPACTS

The proposed action is consistent with the current Board-adopted budget and is affordable within Sound Transit's current long-term financial plan and the sub-area financial capacity. There are no additional revenues associated with this action.

# M/W/DBE - SMALL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION

As a Transit Vehicle Manufacturer, Gillig Corporation must submit its own DBE program and goal to the FTA, and by FTA's transit vehicle procurement rules, Transit Vehicle Manufacturers must certify to transit agencies that they have a DBE program in place. Gillig Corporation has complied with FTA rules for this procurement and has indicated that its DBE participation is 10% for this contract.

#### **EEO Commitment**

The employees of Gillig Corporation will perform the construction and assembly of the buses. Gillig Corporation's workforce demographics are 11% women and 65% minorities. Gillig Corporation will comply with all FTA EEO policies and procedures.

This contract will deliver two of the 31 buses planned in the 2003 Service Implementation Plan (SIP) with the target delivery in the third quarter 2005. In April 2004, the Sound Transit Board authorized the fleet procurement process for this fleet by piggybacking on the purchase options available with the Community Transit Transit's Gillig bus contract 03-02. The piggyback contract process reduces delivery time and administration costs. Also, it expedites the purchase process and is fully eligible for the federal grant funding. In May 2004 through a signed Letter of Agreement, Community Transit agreed to assign these options to Sound Transit.

Sound Transit has been operating 90, 40-foot diesel buses since the start of the Regional Express service in 1999. The new fleet will be built virtually with the same specifications that include luggage racks, reading lamps, air-conditioning, and reclining seats. Also, included are electronic fare-boxes and American Disability Act (ADA) approved wheelchair lifts. Upon delivery, these buses will be operated by Community Transit to enhance various Regional Express services originating from the Snohomish subarea.

The Community Transit vehicle maintenance staff will provide the bus construction and acceptance inspections. Upon delivery, this fleet will be operated by the Community Transit to enhance various Regional Express services originating from the Snohomish County subarea.

### CONSEQUENCES OF DELAY

Postponing this action may result in late delivery of the fleet with subsequent delay in service change implementation in 2005.

A motion of the Finance Committee of the Central Puget Sound Regional Transit Authority to authorize the Chief Executive Officer to execute a contract with Gillig Corporation for the manufacture and delivery of two standard floor 40-foot diesel buses in an amount not to exceed \$679,488.

## **Background:**

This motion is to execute a contract with Gillig Corporation for the manufacture and delivery of two, 40-foot diesel buses identified in the approved 2003 Regional Express Service Implementation Plan. In April 2004, the Sound Transit Board authorized the fleet procurement process for this fleet by piggybacking on the purchase options available with the Community Transit's Gillig bus contract 03-02.

Sound Transit has been operating 90, 40-foot diesel buses since the start of the Regional Express service in 1999. The new fleet will be built virtually with the same specifications that include luggage racks, reading lamps, air conditioning, and reclining seats. Also included are electronic fare-boxes and American Disability Act approved wheelchair lifts. Upon delivery, these buses will be operated by Community Transit to enhance various Regional Express services originating from the Snohomish County subarea.

The target delivery of the buses is the third quarter of 2005.
