PROJECT NAME

Tukwila Commuter Rail Station

PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the Chief Executive Officer to execute a contract with KPFF to provide an Alternatives Analysis and a Project Sequencing Plan for the Tukwila Station in the amount of \$249,688 with a 10% contingency of \$24,969, for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$274,657.

KEY FEATURES of PROPOSED ACTION

- Defines a scope of work for assessing alternative development options and recommending a sequencing plan for the preferred option.
- Reserves the ability for the Sound Transit Board to authorize subsequent work by KPFF to provide preliminary engineering, additional environmental documentation if required, and to develop final design documents for elements identified in the sequencing plan.

BUDGET IMPACT SUMMARY

There is no action outside of the Board-adopted budget; there are no contingency funds required, no subarea impacts, or funding required from other parties other than what is already assumed in the financial plan.

BUDGET and FINANCIAL PLAN DISCUSSION

The Adopted 2006 Budget for the Tukwila Station is \$16,024,011 with a preliminary engineering phase budget of \$400,000. The proposed action is to execute a contract with KPFF to provide an alternatives analysis and a project sequencing plan for the Tukwila Station in the amount of \$249,688 with a 10% contingency of \$24,969 for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$274,657. This leaves a remaining preliminary engineering phase balance of \$125,343. The remaining balance for the project is \$7,366,349.

There are sufficient funds to complete this action. Committing these funds will not endanger any other project elements that are to be funded out of the overall project.

KPFF's overall commitment is a 16% M/W/DBE and small business goal for all phases of the project, alternatives analysis and project sequencing plan, and then preliminary engineering and final design, if Sound Transit elects to award the later phases. The limited scope of the alternatives analysis and project sequencing plan has 5.6% small business participation. However, in later phases of work preliminary engineering, environmental documentation and final design subconsultants will be key design team participants.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION and BACKGROUND for PROPOSED ACTION

Commuter rail service to Tukwila is currently provided at a temporary Tukwila Station constructed in February 2001 for the start up of Sounder service.

The permanent station would be constructed south of Longacres Way and immediately adjacent to the BNSF railroad tracks along the Renton and Tukwila city limits. The major station components could include two platforms with passenger shelters, a bus drop-off area, Amtrak and Sounder ticket vending machines, vehicle parking and bike lockers.

Under this contract, KPFF will analyze alternatives for phasing the permanent Tukwila Station improvements. This sequencing plan will assist Sound Transit in determining the most cost effective way (if any) to develop this project with about \$7.37 million in remaining project budget. The consultant team will also review existing environmental documentation and help determine if additional environmental documentation is required for the recommended alternative. If required, Sound Transit may choose to contract with KPFF for the remaining balance of the preliminary engineering and environmental documentation work and enter into final design. Any additional work by KPFF past the alternatives analysis and sequencing plan will be brought to the Board for consideration and authorization.
