Ms. Carol Doering, acting Board Administrator, stated a quorum of the Board was present at roll call.

Report of the Chair

Mr. Ladenburg announced that the Executive Committee meeting would be rescheduled from February 1st to February 8, 2007 due to a schedule conflict with Legislative Day at the State Capitol in Olympia. He also announced that the meeting will be held jointly with the Executive Board of the Regional Transportation Investment District.

Mr. Ladenburg announced that an executive session would be held following action items and committee reports.

Chief Executive Officer's Report

Ms. Earl announced the kick-off of the state performance audit to be conducted by the TKW firm of Portland, Oregon. She also provided an update on various transportation bills that are before the 2007 State Legislature.

Ms. Earl presented the annual 2006 and 2007 Agency Milestones Report. She stated that 22 of 38 milestones were achieved in 2006. Highlighting the 2006 achievements, she reported ridership on trains and buses in 2006 carried approximately 12 million passengers. For 2007 she identified 43 milestones. A major focus for 2007 is Sound Transit 2 (ST2). The ST2 package will be part of the Roads & Transit plan scheduled to go to voters in November of 2007.

She announced that The Adopted 2007 Budget would exceed \$1 billion in operating expenditures and capital outlays.

Mr. Ladenburg invited Virginia Gunby, Chair of the Performance Audit Committee (PAC) to present a letter on the committee's behalf related to the Motion. A copy of the letter is on file with the Board Administrator.

Mr. Ladenburg, Mr. Marin and Mr. Enslow acknowledged the valuable service provided by the PAC.

It was moved by Mr. Marin, seconded by Ms. Burleigh, and carried by the unanimous vote of all members present that Motion No. M2007-13 be approved as presented.

Motion No. M2007-15 - Appointing members to the Diversity Oversight Committee and authorizing the chief executive officer to execute a contract not to exceed \$50,000, for facilitation services in support of the newly formed Diversity Oversight Committee.

Leslie Jones, Diversity Program Manager gave the staff presentation.

It was moved by Mr. Marin, seconded by Ms. Anderson, and carried by the unanimous vote of all members present that Motion No. M2007-15 be approved as presented.

Items forwarded by the Finance Committee

Motion No. M2007-09 - Authorizing the chief executive officer to execute a contract amendment with Mass Electric Construction Co. to provide the traction electrification system for Airport Link in the amount of \$6,200,000, with a contingency of 7% totaling \$434,000, for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$45,597,386.

It was moved by Mr. Butler, seconded by Mr. Marin, and carried by the unanimous vote of all members present that Motion No. M2007-09 be approved as presented.

Motion No. M2007-10 - Authorizing the chief executive officer to execute a contract amendment with GE Transportation Systems Global Signaling, LLC to provide the train signal systems for Airport Link in the amount of \$3,304,352, with a contingency of 7% totaling \$231,305, for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$35,924,386

It was moved by Mr. Butler, seconded by Mr. Marin, and carried by the unanimous vote of all members present that Motion No. M2007-10 be approved as presented.

Motion No. M2007-11 – Authorizing the chief executive officer to execute a contract amendment with GE Transportation Systems Global Signaling, LLC to provide the communication systems for Airport Link and to complete the communications system for the Central Link Light Rail Initial Segment in the amount of \$6,450,001, with a contingency of \$346,930, for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$38,793,889

It was moved by Mr. Butler, seconded by Mr. Marin, and carried by the unanimous vote of all members present that Motion No. M2007-11 be approved as presented.

Motion No. M2007-08 — Authorizing the chief executive officer to execute a contract amendment with Willis of Seattle, Inc. to provide Owner Controlled Insurance Program insurance brokerage services for Sound Transit through December 31, 2007, in the amount of \$75,000 for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$375,000

It was moved by Mr. Butler, seconded by Mr. Marin, and carried by the unanimous vote of all members present that Motion No. M2007-08 be approved as presented.

Mr. Ladenburg announced he would postpone committee reports to the next Board meeting.

Executive Session

At 2:23 p.m., Chair Ladenburg announced that the Board would convene a 40-minute executive session on two items, authorized under RCW 42.30.110. The first was to review negotiations on the performance of publicly bid contracts when public knowledge regarding such consideration would cause a likelihood of increased costs and when public knowledge regarding the discussion is likely to result in an adverse legal or financial consequence to the agency.

The second was to discuss with legal counsel representing the agency matters relating to agency enforcement actions, or to discuss with legal counsel representing the agency litigation or potential litigation to which the agency, the governing body, or a member acting in an official capacity is, or is likely to become, a party, when public knowledge regarding the discussion is likely to result in an adverse legal or financial consequence to the agency.
