## PROJECT NAME

Kirkland Transit Center/3<sup>rd</sup> Street

## PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to increase the contingency for the contract with INCA Engineers Inc. for the Kirkland Transit Center/3<sup>rd</sup> Street project in the amount of \$45,000, for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$1,024,279.

## KEY FEATURES of PROPOSED ACTION

- The Kirkland City Council requested that Sound Transit take additional steps to ensure the project design concept works well with Peter Kirk Park and downtown development. These steps have been funded using the remaining contract contingency.
- The proposed action would provide sufficient additional contract contingency to complete the balance of the preliminary engineering for the Kirkland Transit Center/3<sup>rd</sup> Street project.

## BUDGET IMPACT SUMMARY

Project Name:Kirkland Transit Center/3rd StreetCurrent Project Phase:Preliminary Engineering / Environmental DocumentationProjected Completion Date:To be determined.

There is no action required outside of the Board-adopted budget; there are no project contingency funds required, no subarea impacts, or funding required from other parties other than what is already assumed in the financial plan.

## **BUDGET AND FINANCIAL PLAN DISCUSSION**

The Adopted 2007 Budget for this project is \$13,300,000, with a preliminary engineering phase budget of \$1,050,000. The proposed action would leave a remaining preliminary engineering phase budget of \$25,721 and a remaining uncommitted balance for the project budget of \$11,608,832.

There are sufficient funds to complete this action within the project's preliminary engineering phase budget. Committing these funds will not endanger any other project elements that are to be funded out of the overall project.

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION and BACKGROUND for PROPOSED ACTION

This project will provide a new Kirkland Transit Center in downtown Kirkland on 3rd Street between Kirkland Avenue and Central Way adjacent to Peter Kirk Park.

The original consultant contract included design and public outreach support for selecting a transit center project in downtown Kirkland. This early design and outreach included stakeholder meetings, public open houses, and City Council meetings. Based on this early design and outreach, the project's Executive Advisory Committee – senior staff from Sound Transit, the City of Kirkland, and King County Metro – unanimously supported a project on 3rd Street involving some use of Peter Kirk Park.

The Kirkland City Council requested that Sound Transit take additional steps to gather input from the community about how the project's design concepts integrate with improvements in Peter Kirk Park and in the City's commercial areas. The additional steps requested by the Kirkland City Council can be funded through use of the remaining contract contingency. The proposed action would provide sufficient additional contract contingency to complete the balance of the preliminary engineering for the Kirkland Transit Center/3rd Street project.
