PROJECT NAME

Unarmed Security Services

PROPOSED ACTION

Ratify a contract amendment with Securitas Security Services to provide unarmed security services in the amount of \$324,544.34 for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$8,089,288.34.

KEY FEATURES of PROPOSED ACTION

- This contract modification provides for unplanned security services. The services include unplanned coverage of Sounder trains and platforms, an unplanned increase in coverage at the Federal Way Transit Center and unplanned coverage for recently acquired Capitol Hill real estate.
- This modification provides for unplanned funding for the 2007 2008 unarmed security services contract, but does not exceed the 2008 overall Sound Transit security budget.
- The contract amount previously authorized by the Board is inadequate to cover the costs of unplanned security services, therefore staff is seeking Board ratification of a contract amendment.

BUDGET IMPACT SUMMARY

There is no action outside of the Board-adopted budget; there are no contingency funds required, no subarea impacts, or funding required from other parties other than what is already assumed in the financial plan.

BUDGET and FINANCIAL PLAN DISCUSSION

The proposed action will ratify a contract amendment with Securitas Security Services to provide additional services in the first quarter of 2008.

The additional services will be funded through a combination of Sounder operations service budget, ST Express operations service budget, Tacoma Link operations service budget, and non-operating expenses budget. The Adopted 2008 Budget includes \$13,491,247 for Sounder Services, \$6,445,239 for ST Express Services, \$972,506 for Tacoma Link Security Services. The total budget for non-operating expenses is \$6,514,678. The costs under the proposed action for Sounder were \$216,000, for ST Express were \$56,000, for Tacoma Link were \$10,000, and for non-operating expenses were \$43,000. The combined funding source is sufficient to fund this proposed action.

In 2005, Sound Transit awarded a one-year contract with two one-year options to extend with Securitas for unarmed security services for Sounder commuter rail, Tacoma Link, Sound Transit parking garages, park and ride lots and administration buildings. This contract modification provides for unplanned security expenses that occurred due to various unforeseen circumstances. These expenses included continuation of unarmed security officers riding Sounder trains and at station platforms, additional security coverage of the Federal Way Transit Center following a major incident in January 2008, and security for the early acquisition of Capitol Hill real estate to support the University Link extension.

In 2007, the Sound Transit Board approved the execution of the second and last one-year extension for the current contract. This authorized Securitas Security Services to provide unarmed security services for an additional \$1.8 million dollars. This amount was approximately 1/3 less than either of the two previous years despite system expansions and ridership increases. As security assignments were realigned to reflect changing circumstances, associated security costs were not updated in a manner that identified total costs in relationship to the contract balance. The combination of related contracts starting later than anticipated, staffing revisions, and unforeseen activities described above have resulted in these additional expenses.
