PROJECT NAME

University Link - Pine Street Stub Tunnel (PSST) to University of Washington (UW) Station

PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to 1) execute an agreement with the University of Washington for project-related construction services, betterments, and post-final design change management in the amount of \$2,000,000, with a contingency of \$200,000 for a total authorized agreement amount not to exceed \$2,200,000 and 2) ratify actions taken to authorize the University of Washington to perform certain, limited utility service connection and restoration work at the University of Washington Station site, and 3) approve execution of the first Task Order under this new agreement for that work.

KEY FEATURES of PROPOSED ACTION

- Under this agreement, Sound Transit would reimburse the University of Washington (UW) for project-related expenses associated with the University Link construction and the UW would reimburse Sound Transit for site restoration betterments or certain, requested post-final design changes in the project. The performing party will furnish services in support of the project, as described within each task order.
- The scope of this agreement covers services to be provided in the following areas:
 - 1. Construction Services Sound Transit would reimburse UW for UW contractors' work including responding to: a) requests to identify underground utilities, b) conduct temporary power outages, c) install communication lines, d) complete irrigation connections, e) relocate UW facilities prior to demolition by Sound Transit contractors, and f) provide limited, project-related site restoration work.
 - 2. Betterments included at the request of UW and reimbursed by Sound Transit to UW. As of this date, negotiated betterments are underground utility upgrades provided where University facilities need relocation prior to construction of UW Station.
 - 3. Post-Final Design Changes requiring work not included with Sound Transit contracts at the time of bid (or proposal) that may be requested by UW in support of other UW capital projects in progress. UW will reimburse Sound Transit for this type of work.

- 4. Mitigation consisting of services or work required to mitigate a project impact not previously anticipated and included in Sound Transit contracts at the time of Bid (or Proposal). No reimbursement will occur in this category unless UW completes the services or work by task order as a construction service to the project.
- Contingency amounts will be included in each applicable task order budget.
- The proposed action includes approval of the first task order, which would ratify actions taken by Sound
 Transit to authorize UW to complete a 600A power utility service connection and site landscape
 restoration work necessary for the startup of the replacement kitchen modular building at the UW Station
 site near Husky Stadium. The work performed by UW will be defined as the first task order in the
 amount of \$312,000 under the agreement and reimbursed upon execution.
- The work was authorized because circumstances necessitated that the UW on-call contractors be directed to perform certain, limited work prior to the Board approving this agreement or alternatively amending existing agreements. This limited scope of work was necessary in order to allow Sound Transit to meet its obligations as defined in the January 7, 2009 Letter of Concurrence between Sound Transit and the UW. The Letter of Concurrence required that the replacement kitchen and office building be ready for occupancy by July 31, 2009 and the remaining buildings be available for use by August 31, 2009. The obligations were met and all of the work is substantially complete.
- This agreement allows amendment by future Board action to accommodate North Link construction without renegotiating the underlying terms.

BUDGET and FINANCIAL PLAN DISCUSSION

The Adopted 2009 Lifetime Capital Budget for University Link is \$1.756 billion. Within that amount, \$2,000,000 has been set aside for Construction Work by Others within the construction phase.

Since no specific line item was budgeted for Construction Work by UW in the construction phase, the proposed action would be added to Construction Work by Others, which is fully committed. Approval of the proposed action would increase commitments for this line item to \$4,200,000 and result in a shortfall of \$2,200,000, which will be funded from surplus budget in the line item for U220 TBM Tunnels UW Station to Capitol Hill Station within the construction phase.

The proposed action is consistent with the current adopted budget and is affordable within the agency's long-term financial plan and sub-area financial capacity. The action will have no new revenue impact on Sound Transit.

SMALL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION

University of Washington staff will perform the work tasks conducted under this agreement. Any construction or procurement of services by the University will be done consistent with the University's M/W/DBE Small Business Participation Program.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION and BACKGROUND for PROPOSED ACTION

Sound Transit and the UW have previously entered into a Memorandum of Agreement (dated July 12, 2000) and this Agreement was amended by a Master Implementation Agreement (MIA), dated July 2007. The MIA contemplates the need that future agreements between the Sound Transit and the UW relating to design and construction

Based on the recent experience and lessons learned during the completion of the advance utility and facilities work on campus, Sound Transit and the UW have identified the need to establish a specific agreement to improve change management procedures. This proposed agreement is intended to better define the process to address future UW change requests that may arise as design and construction work proceeds on the heavy civil underground construction and the stations finishes contracts that will take place on the UW campus.

One of the lessons learned ties to the installation and commissioning of temporary facilities outside Husky Stadium that took place this past summer just prior to the start of the 2009 football season. In the course of doing this work, several issues and constraints were encountered that precipitated a number of field changes late in the construction schedule. Assessing the risks, Sound Transit determined that the UW's contractor should complete certain tasks because the UW was uniquely positioned to quickly respond to the emerging issues and minimize impacts to the schedule deadlines. The team successfully completed all the necessary work before the start of the football season; still, the UW's contractors completed more task work than originally anticipated resulting in the ratification action.

The proposed agreement establishes procedure that defines and captures the negotiation record for post-final design change requests and documents each task order. In this agreement task orders are defined by one of four categories: (1) construction services completed by UW and reimbursed by Sound Transit, (2) betterments completed by Sound Transit and reimbursed by UW, (3) changes in conformed U-Link contract documents (plans or specifications) requiring reimbursement by UW, and (4) changes in U-Link contract documents necessary to implement a mitigation for project construction impacts, not requiring reimbursement. Work will be managed by task orders at the discretion of the Sound Transit Executive Director of Engineering, Design and Construction and UW Associate Vice President of Capital Projects, subject to the terms of the agreement.

CONSEQUENCES of DELAY

The UW Station and Tunnels contract work is scheduled to begin on January 4, 2010 and a number of related construction services and betterment task orders are contemplated for execution under this agreement. Delay in approving this action may increase costs of certain change orders and restrict Sound Transit's ability to coordinate with the proposed future Husky Stadium renovation project.

The construction activities addressed by the first task order are in the north gate area of the University of Washington's Husky Stadium. The University of Washington insisted that no construction work take place during the football season; therefore it was critically important that all work be completed before the end of August 2009. Therefore, it was necessary to authorize certain, limited work prior to obtaining Board authorization. Delaying ratification of the first task order may delay payment to the University for completed work.
