## **PROJECT NAME**

Central Link Initial Segment

## **ACTION**

Authorizes the chief executive officer to increase the contingency for the contract with PB Americas, Inc. (previously Parsons Brinckerhoff Construction Services, Inc.) to provide continuing construction management services for the Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel civil construction, in the amount of \$1,800,000, for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$20,400,000.

#### **KEY FEATURES**

- The request for an increase in contingency is due, in large part, to the construction of the Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel taking longer to complete than originally anticipated by the contract. Because construction management oversight duration is tied directly to the duration of the contractor's construction period, the construction management team's time on site must be extended.
- Contingency is partly needed due to increased work loads for the following contract functions:
  - document control support
  - quality assurance survey support
  - support of voids investigation
- This amendment will provide additional funds to continue the on-going normal construction management services for the Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel.

## **BUDGET DISCUSSION**

The Adopted 2009 Lifetime Capital Budget for the Central Link Initial Segment is \$2.07 billion. Within that amount \$18,600,000 has been set aside for construction management services for the Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel civil construction contract (C710) in the construction services phase.

The proposed action would increase current commitments for this line item by \$1,800,000 for a revised total commitment of \$20,400,000, and result in a budget shortfall of \$1,800,000. This will be partly funded with the \$1,051,499 unallocated contingency remaining for this phase, but still result in a budget shortfall of \$687,566 for the total construction services phase that would require funding from surplus budget within other phases of the Initial Segment project.

Within the construction services phase of the Initial Segment project, \$1,051,499 has been set aside for unallocated contingency. Should the proposed action be approved, this entire amount would be utilized, leaving no remaining unallocated contingency in this phase.

The proposed action is within the Adopted 2009 Budget, and is affordable within the agency's long-term financial plan and subarea financial capacity. The action will have no new revenue impact on Sound Transit.

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION and BACKGROUND for PROPOSED ACTION

Construction for Beacon Hill started in the summer of 2004. The Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel contract includes the construction of light rail facilities in tunnel and on aerial structures from Airport Way South through Beacon Hill to a location near the intersection of Rainier Avenue and Martin Luther King Way. It also includes the construction of the Beacon Hill Station (underground) and the Mt. Baker Station (aerial structure).

The construction management services provided under this contract include:

- highly specialized sequential excavation mining inspectors
- · an environmental oversight consultant
- a quality assurance surveying consultant
- a quality assurance testing laboratory

## **CONSEQUENCES OF DELAY**

Construction is underway for the Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel. PB Americas, Inc. is essential for construction management, administration and oversight of construction during the construction period. Without the continuing support of PB Americas, Inc., Sound Transit would not be able to effectively and efficiently manage the construction being performed by the civil construction contractor and its subcontractors. A delay in Finance Committee action and Board approval could impact the orderly management and oversight of construction activities.

## **PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT**

Sound Transit continues to work cooperatively with the City of Seattle, King County Metro, Washington State Department of Transportation, the Department of Ecology, and local businesses and interest groups on the Central Link Light Rail Project. Sound Transit staff continues to keep local and area residents informed about the status of the project and the impact of construction on the affected neighborhoods.

#### **Background:**
