PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a contract amendment with Michael Minor Associates to provide additional noise and vibration consultant services for the Central Link Initial Segment project in the amount of \$224,948, with a 10% contingency of \$22,495 totaling \$247,443, for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$447,183.

KEY FEATURES

 This action amends the existing contract with Michael Minor Associates to provide continued and additional noise and vibration monitoring in Tukwila and Rainier Valley, mitigation testing and development, reference noise measurements of the light rail vehicle, wheel-rail interface analysis, and on-call services.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The 14-mile Initial Segment of the Central Link light rail line has a northern terminus in the Pine Street Stub Tunnel (PSST), with passenger service beginning at Westlake Station serving downtown Seattle, the SODO industrial area, Beacon Hill, Rainier Valley, and Tukwila. Passenger stations include Westlake, University Street, Pioneer Square, International District/Chinatown, Stadium, SODO, Beacon Hill, Mount Baker, Columbia City, Othello, Rainier Beach, and Tukwila International Boulevard. The Operations and Maintenance Facility and Yard is located south of South Forest Street.

EQUAL EMPLOYMENT WORKFORCE PROFILE

The consultant team has 10 employees; including 20% women and 20% minorities.

BACKGROUND

The consultant firm Michael Minor Associates was hired through a competitive procurement process in April 2009 to provide noise and vibration consultant services for the Central Link Initial Segment and Airport Link. The original contract amount was for \$151,830. The contract amount was increased to \$199,740 to provide additional services within the original scope of work. Since then, investigation of complaints, field monitoring and analysis of these issues has used up the existing contract budget. Additional consultant support is necessary to properly respond to and evaluate the remaining issues, design and test mitigation measures, and provide follow-up measurements to confirm the effectiveness of new mitigation measures.

The consultant was originally hired to respond to noise and vibration complaints, provide noise monitoring, and develop noise mitigation measures for the Initial Segment. This proposed action will provide additional noise and vibration monitoring, analysis and mitigation development services for the Initial Segment operational noise issues. Specific tasks include two years of noise and vibration monitoring and analysis in the City of Tukwila, a wheel-rail interface study, on-call services to respond to complaints, support mitigation design development, attend meetings, and provide technical support as needed.

Noise complaints and noise levels exceeding the federal criteria from operation of the Initial Segment have been much more extensive than anticipated when the original contract was developed in spring 2009 before the system opened for revenue service. Unanticipated issues include wheel squeal on curves, crossover switch noise, vehicle and street crossing warning bells, high frequency wheel-rail noise, and overall higher noise levels than predicted in some areas. Investigation of complaints, field monitoring and analysis of these issues has used up the existing contract budget. Additional consultant support is necessary to properly respond to and evaluate the remaining issues, design and test mitigation measures, and provide follow-up measurements to confirm the effectiveness of new mitigation measures.
