PROPOSED ACTION

Appointing Mr. Harold Wirch and Mr. Philip Lovell to the Citizen Oversight Panel for a term of four years beginning March 2011 and expiring March 2015.

KEY FEATURES

- The purpose of this action is to fill two vacancies on the Citizen Oversight Panel (COP). These appointments will fulfill the minimum representation requirement of two members for each subarea.
- Letters and resumes were mailed to Boardmembers on February 18, 2011.
- This motion is being brought directly to the Board for action prior to the next Executive Committee
 meeting scheduled on March 3, 2011 in order to expedite the appointment process and enable the Panel
 to fully represent the community.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Sound Transit COP is a 15-member panel of citizen volunteers appointed by the Sound Transit Board to monitor and report on Sound Transit performance in delivering on the commitments it made in Sound Move and ST2.

The COP is an advisory committee charged with an annual review of Sound Transit's performance and financial plan, and provides reports and recommendations to the Board. Under Sound Move, the COP monitors Sound Transit's performance in the following areas:

- · adherence to its public commitments
- open and timely involvement of citizens
- the process of evaluating project alternatives
- capital and operating budgets and finance plans
- management of the regional fund
- · equity in subarea budgets and reporting
- · adherence to schedules and budgets
- review of annual performance audits

FISCAL INFORMATION

There is no action outside of the Board-adopted budget; there are no contingency funds required, no subarea impacts, or funding required from other parties other than what is already assumed in the financial plan.

The Sound Transit Board created a Citizen Oversight Panel in 1996 to monitor Sound Transit's performance in carrying out its commitments under Sound Move.
