PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a ten-month contract with EMC Research, Inc., to conduct the Link Initial Segment Before and After Study as required by the Federal Transit Administration and the Sound Transit Origin/Destination Study in the amount of \$584,026, with a 10% contingency of \$58,403, for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$642,429.

KEY FEATURES

This contract will provide data collection and analysis for two projects:

- The Link Initial Segment Before & After Study (B&A), a requirement by the FTA, and
- The Sound Transit Origin/Destination Study.

The scope includes:

- Sampling and data analysis plan development,
- Questionnaire development,
- Data collection,
- Data preparation, processing and analysis,
- Reporting.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project includes a comprehensive set of services for the planning, development, execution, analysis, and reporting of the data collection of transit passenger trip characteristics for the Initial Segment B&A Study and the Sound Transit Origin/Destination Study. The FTA requires data be collected in fall 2011 (two years after Link began service) in accordance with the B&A Study Plan that was submitted to FTA and approved in 2003.

FISCAL INFORMATION

This contract will be funded from three different budgets. The work related to the Initial Segment B&A Study will be funded from the Central Link Operations budget and the Initial Segment budget. The Sound Transit Origin/Destination Study will be funded from the Fare Administration budget.

BACKGROUND

The Initial Segment Before and After Study is a requirement of the Full Funding Grant Agreement with the FTA. The study provides an investigation of ridership patterns that will be based on collecting the origins and destinations of transit riders in the corridor served by the Initial Segment and Airport Link. Data will also include access mode, trip purpose, transfers, fare media, and limited demographic information. The data will be compared against data collected in fall 2008, before the Initial Segment opened for service. The data will also be compared to projections made by Sound Transit during project development. The B&A Study Final Report is scheduled to be completed in mid-2012. The comparisons will be used by the FTA and Sound Transit to evaluate the impacts of the project and evaluate technical methods and procedures used for planning and development.

EMC will also conduct the Origin/Destination Study, which will provide ridership data collected onboard Sounder, ST Express, Central Link and Tacoma Link. The FTA requires collection of the data to update Sound Transit's ridership model used to support New Starts grant applications. In addition, the data will provide Sound Transit planning staff a holistic view of Sound Transit's system, its riders and how they use the existing network. The data will be compared with a study conducted in 2008-2009 and used to analyze the change in rider patterns since Link began operation and the ORCA fare payment system was regionally implemented. The results will be used for updating the agency's ridership model, fare modeling, marketing and business development projects, planning efforts including parking, pricing, and station access, and transit planning.

The two separate studies are included in one contract to capture project and contract efficiencies by combining the two, including:

- Combining two projects that require the same contractor skills and qualifications,
- A streamlined procurement and administration for one consultant contract,
- The opportunity to combine the data collection on board Central Link trains, since both projects will be collecting data from Central Link riders,
- A more competitive and higher quality procurement due to the overall size of the combined contract.

EMC Research, Inc. was selected through a competitive RFP procurement process. Six proposals were received and evaluated, and two firms were selected for additional interviews. EMC Research, Inc. was chosen as the firm that will provide the best value and Sound Transit has issued a Notice of Intent to Award.

Analysis of Contracting Out vs. Performing In-House

These services require specialized skills and significant staffing requirements that cannot be provided using existing Sound Transit staff. Due to the project's short time frame, it is not feasible for Sound Transit to hire additional staff to complete this work.
