PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a contract with Frank Coluccio Construction Company to provide construction services for two retaining walls located in the vicinity of the Beacon Hill Tunnels eastern portal on 26th Avenue South within the Central Link Initial Segment project in the amount of \$219,677, with a 10% contingency of \$21,968, for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$241,645.

KEY FEATURES

- Under this contract, Frank Coluccio Construction Company will install two retaining walls along 26th Avenue South in Seattle.
- This work is required to repair and prevent future erosion of the embankment in front of two Seattle City Light utility vaults. One retaining wall is located on the eastside of 26th Avenue South and is required to stabilize the embankment between 26th Avenue South and private property adjacent to the road. The other retaining wall is located at the corner of 26th Avenue South and South Forest Street adjacent to the University of Washington Central Laundry.
- The contract scope of work includes:
 - Excavation and backfill
 - Installation of soldier pile retaining wall
 - o Construction of a segmental concrete retaining wall
 - o Traffic control
 - Asphalt and concrete removal and replacement
 - Final grading and fencing

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The 14-mile Central Link Initial Segment connecting Tukwila with downtown Seattle opened in 2009. The 2012 Adopted Budget provides funds for final tasks to complete follow-on work items including property restoration and systems acceptance, and close out of the project.

Fiscal Information

The 2012 Adopted Budget includes funding for the proposed 26th Avenue South Retaining Walls installation as follow-on work required to complete the Initial Segment project.

This action is within the adopted budget and sufficient monies remain after approval of this action to fund the remaining work in the Construction phase as contained in the current cost estimates.

BACKGROUND

This action would authorize repair of a 120 foot-long embankment along the eastside of 26th Avenue South in Seattle using a soldier pile retaining wall system. This retaining wall is needed to

prevent future erosion of the embankment onto the private property located adjacent to 26th Avenue South.

This action also includes the repair of a 40 foot long embankment at the corner of 26th Avenue South and South Forest Street using concrete retaining wall blocks. This work is required to repair the embankment in front two Seattle City Light utility vaults. Erosion of the embankment occurred during the construction of the Central Link project. Currently the two utility vaults do not meet Seattle City Light requirements. There is temporary erosion control in place to prevent short-term erosion.

This contract was competitively bid in June 2012, Sound Transit received four bids. Frank Coluccio Construction Co. was determined to be the lowest, responsive responsible bidder. The engineer's estimate is \$255,666.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE
