Contract Amendment for Final Design and Permitting Services for the ST Express Mid-day Bus Storage Project

PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a contract amendment with PB Americas, Inc. to provide final design and permitting services for the ST Express Mid-day Bus Storage Project in the amount of \$337,332, with a 10% contingency of \$33,733 totaling \$371,065, for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$1,456,747.

KEY FEATURES SUMMARY

- The ST Express Mid-day Bus Storage project will provide permanent storage during the day for up to 30 buses that provide service between downtown Seattle and the Tacoma area during peak hours.
- PB Americas, Inc. has completed preliminary engineering and environmental documentation for the project. The proposed contract amendment would authorize completion of final design and permitting, as well as design assistance during the bid and construction process. These tasks were included as optional task orders within the original contract and are funded by this contract amendment.
- Final design and permitting is expected to take approximately nine months, with design assistance during the bid and construction process continuing through mid-2014.
- The site being used for this project is located directly across the street from the Link Operations and Maintenance Facility (OMF). Sound Transit already owns this property, so there are no real estate acquisition costs.

BACKGROUND

The ST Express Bus Base project is a component of the voter-approved ST2 plan and is included in the 2012 Transit Improvement Plan (TIP). The Mid-day Bus Storage project was a component of the Bus Base project. The Mid-day Bus Storage project has passed through Gates 1 through 4 of the Agency's Phase Gate process for capital project management. A SEPA checklist was prepared and a determination of non-significance (DNS) issued, no comments were received and the environmental review process is complete.

Sound Transit currently stores 30 buses that are operated by Pierce Transit. These buses provide peak hour service between Seattle and Tacoma that are operated by Pierce Transit. They are stored at the Link Light Rail OMF employee parking area during the day, saving approximately \$300,000 to \$500,000 a year in fuel costs, plus mileage and vehicle maintenance costs. A permanent mid-day storage site is needed because the parking area will be needed in mid-2014 as we mobilize to start systems integration and "start-up" testing for the University Link and South 200th Street extensions.

The site that has been identified for the project is land previously acquired by Sound Transit for the Beacon Hill Tunnel staging. There is no cost for the property since it is already owned by Sound Transit. The project location allows buses to quickly begin their return trips in downtown Seattle to the Tacoma area.

Elements of the project include: grading, paving, striping, drainage, illumination, and landscaping. The site will only be used during the day on weekdays, and secured when not in use.

The consultant contract covers the scope for the ST Express Bus Base as well as the scope for the ST Express Mid-Day Bus Storage. The budget table shows the commitments for each of the projects as well as the total contract commitments.

The contract includes initial project development tasks as well as options to include preliminary engineering and environmental documentation. It also included an option to perform final design. Project development, preliminary engineering and environmental documentation are now complete; final design is anticipated to take approximately nine months.

The scope of work under this contract amendment includes; permit assistance (including submission of required technical reports), development of design and specifications through final design, design support services during the contract solicitation and construction phases and asbuilt drawings after the project is complete.

Staff will return to the Capital Committee to request approval to award a contract for construction services.

FISCAL IMPACT

The 2012 TIP included \$777,000 for the Mid-day Bus Storage Project. Within that amount, \$390,000 has been set aside for the final design phase. The proposed action would commit \$371,065 to the final design services line item, leaving a remaining phase budget balance of \$18,935.

The proposed action is consistent with the current adopted budget, and sufficient monies remain after approval of this action to fund the remaining work in the final design phase as contained in the current cost estimates. The action is affordable within the agency's long-term financial plan and subarea financial capacity, and will have no new revenue impact on Sound Transit.

TIME CONSTRAINTS

A one-month delay in approval of this contract amendment could create a significant impact to the project schedule. Project completion is needed by mid-2014 so that it can replace the temporary mid-day bus storage at the Link Operations and Maintenance Facility employee parking area, which is needed for testing and implementation of the University Link and South 200th Street Extensions.
