PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a contract amendment with Stacy and Witbeck, Inc. to provide track, signal and bridge maintenance services for the Sounder Tacoma to Lakewood segment in the amount of \$1,757,079, for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$10,723,079.

KEY FEATURES SUMMARY

- Stacy and Witbeck Inc. (SWI) maintains track, signals and structures along the Sound Transitowned right of way between Lakewood and Tacoma. Its contract expires in June 2017.
- The contract scope of work includes:
 - o Track, signals and bridge maintenance
 - o Required FRA inspections
 - o Graffiti/vandalism removal within 24 hours
 - Inspection and repairs for unanticipated maintenance needs
 - o Emergency response services as required
 - Ride quality checks
- The contract amendment will provide additional funding for:
 - Routine maintenance work for Sound Transit-owned right of way between Lakewood and Tacoma. Additional funding is needed because this contract was used for work associated with the start-up of the Sounder Tacoma-to-Lakewood segment in 2012, which included rail grinding and flagging services for construction. This work was within the contract scope, but was not anticipated.
 - Routine maintenance work for the new 1.3 mile rail corridor acquired by Sound Transit from the City of Tacoma in 2014.
 - On-going flagging for the reconstruction of the SR 16 bridge taking place over the rail corridor. WSDOT is completing this project and will continue to reimburse Sound Transit monthly for flagging expenses.
- The amount requested is sufficient to cover the additional work for the remaining four years on the contract.

BACKGROUND

Stacy and Witbeck, Inc. was selected through a competitive procurement process to maintain the Sounder Tacoma to Lakewood segment to Federal Railroad Administration passenger rail standards under a five year contract. That contract was approved by the Sound Transit Board on May 24, 2012 via Motion No. M2012-22 and was executed while Sound Transit was preparing to transition the Tacoma to Lakewood segment from construction to operations.

The contract was intended for Sounder operations and maintenance; however, during Sounder Tacoma to Lakewood start-up, unanticipated construction work was identified that needed to be completed in order for the segment to open on schedule. The largest portion of the work consisted of rail grinding to remove rust that had accumulated along the tracks and that was creating irregular conductivity for the signal system. Additionally more flaggers were needed for the testing and commissioning phase of start-up than had been anticipated. Flaggers were needed all along the corridor and at each street crossing. Flaggers are provided under the SWI contract. The contract was used for some minor, unplanned construction clean-up as well.

SWI flagger services are also being used for WSDOT's SR 16 bridge reconstruction work that continues through mid-2014. WSDOT is reimbursing Sound Transit for those flagging services.

The contract amendment will cover funding for Sounder operations and maintenance expenses for unplanned construction during start-up, maintenance of way services for the new 1.3-mile rail segment, and flagging services for the WSDOT bridge reconstruction work.

FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed action will be funded from the Sounder Commuter Rail Services Maintenance of Way budget. The Sounder Services budget of \$25,952,000 includes \$1,085,000 for Maintenance of Way and \$14,867,000 for Other Services. \$1,163,000 of the Maintenance of Way budget has been spent to date and an additional \$285,000 is projected to be spent by the end of 2013. With approval of this amendment there will be a shortfall of \$363,000 in Maintenance of Way. The shortfall will be funded from the Other Services budget within the Sounder operating budget.

The prior year contract spending for Stacy and Witbeck is \$1,422,000, of which, \$754,000 was funded from Sounder Commuter rail operating budget and \$876,000 was funded from Tacoma-Lakewood segment start-up budget. For 2013, expenses include maintenance of way and flagging related to SR 16 construction. The latter is reimbursed by WSDOT.

Future year expenses include maintenance of way for Tacoma-Lakewood segment, flagging and Reservation Junction to FHS. These expenses will be included in future proposed budgets.
