

# ST TOD Program Status

- + Expanded Staff Capacity & Organizing for ST3
- + Board Approved 3 Projects to Progress into Negotiations
  - 1. First Hill
  - 2. Roosevelt
  - 3. Capitol Hill Site D
- Other Current Pipeline Projects: Angle Lake, Columbia City,
  Redmond Technology Center & OMFE
- + Conducted Unsolicited Proposal Process for Beacon Hill
- + Ongoing Board Dialogue & Stakeholder Outreach



#### **2017 Transaction Themes**

- + Engagement and partnerships are critical to success
- Flexibility and creativity are needed to address unique site factors
- Prioritizing development goals yields clarity
- + Pricing property for affordable housing outcomes is work in progress
- + Need regional project experience to fully inform process and procedures



### **Sound Transit's TOD Policy**

What it is: A legislative decision adopted by the Board on Land Use Planning & Development (TOD) in order to implement the agency's governing Washington state legislation and voter-approved plans.

What it does: Directs staff to implement a program that responds to the Board's policy direction

What it needs to do to be useful: It must provide staff with direction, but allow flexibility to respond to great opportunities and create successful project outcomes.

What it is not: a how-to guide for implementation – that lies in process & procedures that are typically more dynamic than a policy and can be updated to reflect change

# **Draft Updated Policy Scope**

#### Equitable Transit Oriented Development

Establishes policy to implement a regional equitable transit oriented development (TOD) strategy for diverse, vibrant, mixed-use and mixed-income communities adjacent to or integrated with Sound Transit stations through land use planning and real property disposition and development per the agency's governing Washington state legislation and voter-approved plans.



## **Draft Updated Policy Priorities**

- 1. Affordable Housing Development: Advance equitable TOD projects on surplus property, air rights and joint development sites by prioritizing affordable housing outcomes in property disposition and development.
- **2. Engagement**: Foster collaboration and engagement with local jurisdictions, stakeholders, communities, and organizations to advance equitable TOD.
- 3. Fiscal Responsibility: Support delivery of the capital program
- **4. Flexibility**: Develop and maintain tools and partnerships that allow for a variety of creative solutions for implementing equitable TOD
- **5. Integrated Planning**: Reflect the core values of equitable TOD, transit integration, non-motorized access and sustainability in delivering the agency's capital program

- + Use Priorities to update goals and strategies
- + Continue discussions on policy content & seek input from stakeholders
  - + Holding workshops with stakeholders focused on topic areas
  - + Ensure regional participation in outreach
- + Board considers first draft of updated policy Q1 2018
- Policy updated by end of April 2018
