PROPOSED ACTION

Appointing Dr. James Peyton to the Citizen Oversight Panel for a term of four years beginning December 1, 2017, and expiring November 30, 2021.

KEY FEATURES SUMMARY

- The purpose of this action is to fill one vacancy on the Citizen Oversight Panel (COP) representing South King County. This appointment will fulfill the minimum representation requirement of two members for each subarea.
- This appointment will bring the membership of the COP up to 13 members.

BACKGROUND

The Sound Transit Citizen Oversight Panel (COP) is a 15-member advisory committee of citizen volunteers appointed by the Sound Transit Board to monitor and report on Sound Transit performance in delivering on the commitments it made in Sound Move, ST2, and ST3.

The COP is charged with an annual review of Sound Transit's performance and financial plan, and provides reports and recommendations to the Board. The COP monitors Sound Transit's performance in the following areas:

- Adherence to its public commitments.
- Open and timely involvement of citizens.
- The process of evaluating project alternatives.
- Capital and operating budgets and finance plans.
- Management of the regional fund.
- Equity in subarea budgets and reporting.
- Adherence to schedules and budgets.
- Review of annual performance audits.

When a vacancy arises on the panel, every attempt is made to fill it with an individual whose skills, experience, and demographic characteristics maintain the panel's geographic balance and diversity. The Citizen Oversight Panel currently has three vacancies. This appointment will fill one vacancy. Recruitment is underway to fill one vacancy in North King County and one vacancy in Pierce County.

Candidate qualifications include:

- Being a registered voter within the Sound Transit District.
- Residing and/or working in King County, Pierce County, or Snohomish County within the Sound Transit district boundary.
- Having experience/skills in one or more areas of expertise related to the panel's responsibilities-business and finance management, engineering, large projects construction

management, public facilities and service, government processes, and public policy development or review.

• Being able to attend meetings twice each month during normal business hours.

Dr. Peyton is a resident of Kent and an Economics and Statistics faculty member at Highline College. Dr. Peyton served on the Sound Transit Link Light Rail Stakeholders Group for the Kent/Des Moines Station. As a member of this group, he reviewed community input and evaluated design elements for area sustainability. He has worked with the Soundside Alliance sub-regional economic development group and has experience with budget and project management in the public sector.
