Contract Amendment for 30 Additional Light Rail Vehicles and Spare Parts

PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a contract amendment with Siemens Industry, Inc. to exercise options for 30 additional Light Rail Vehicles and additional spare parts in the amount of \$124,236,840, with a 6% contingency of \$7,400,000, totaling \$131,636,840, for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$685,491,565.

KEY FEATURES SUMMARY

- The contract amendment with Siemens Industry, Inc. will be used to exercise contract options to procure an additional 30 low-floor light rail vehicles (LRVs) and additional spare parts.
- The option for 30 additional LRVs includes management, quality assurance and testing, field support, shipping and insurance, warranty, and a performance bond.
- The vehicle design for the option vehicles will be the same as that approved for the initial 122 LRVs.
- Delivery of the additional 30 LRVS will be no later than 18-months after delivery of the 122 vehicles authorized by the Board under Motion No. M2016-101.
- The total number of vehicles procured under this contract will increase from 122 to 152 LRVs.
 The increased fleet size will support the Northgate Link, East Link, Lynnwood Link, Redmond, and Federal Way Link Extensions.
- Committing to the order now allows Sound Transit to secure a lower unit price per vehicle than would be available in the contract at a later date.

BACKGROUND

The ST2 Light Rail Vehicle Fleet Expansion project established by Resolution No. R2015-24 provides project management, design, manufacturing, delivery, assembly, inspection, and testing for a procurement of 122 low floor LRVs to meet fleet requirements and support revenue service of all the ST2 light rail expansion projects; and centralized procurement of the LRVs for Northgate Link Extension, Lynnwood Link Extension, and East Link Extension into one project.

In September 2016, under Motion No. M2016-101, the Sound Transit Board approved the procurement of 122 vehicles to support revenue service of Northgate Link Extension, Lynnwood Link Extension, and East Link Extension with an option to procure up to an additional 30 LRVs. With the approval for the ST3 Plan in November 2016, an additional 30 LRVs are needed to support the previous three extensions as well as the Redmond and Federal Way Link Extensions.

A separate action is being sought (Resolution No. R2017-15) to amend the ST2 Light Rail Vehicle Fleet Expansion project baseline budget to provide for this increase to a total procurement of 152 LRVs and changes the project name to Light Rail Vehicle Fleet Expansion.

Exercising the option now with Siemens Industry, Inc. allows Sound Transit to receive the same pricing on material and supplies and realize efficiencies for the previously approved 122 LRVs. Storage capacity for the additional 30 LRVs will be provided through end-of-line storage and at Sound Transit's two Operating and Maintenance Facilities.

FISCAL INFORMATION

The baseline budget for the LRV Fleet Expansion project is \$740,718,000. Within the vehicles phase, \$685,493,000 has been allocated to the budget line item for procurement of Light Rail Vehicles. The proposed action would increase commitments to this line item by \$131,636,840 for a revised total commitment of \$685,491,565, and leave a remaining budget balance of \$1,435.

This action is within the baseline budget and sufficient monies remain after approval of this action to fund the remaining work in the vehicles phase.

TIME CONSTRAINTS

Timely action on this item is required to guarantee pricing on the 30 additional LRVs. After May 15, 2017, higher unit prices and escalation will apply.

PRIOR BOARD/COMMITTEE ACTIONS

Motion No. M2016-101: Authorized the chief executive officer to execute a contract with Siemens Industry, Inc.to provide 122 light rail vehicles for the ST2 light rail expansion projects, including Northgate Link, East Link, and Lynnwood Link Extensions, in an amount not to exceed \$517,621,239, with a 7% contingency of \$36,233,486, for a total authorized amount not to exceed \$553,854,725.
