PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a contract amendment with HDR Engineering, Inc. to provide professional services for the Federal Way Link Extension in the amount of \$10,187,468 with a 10% contingency of \$1,018,747, totaling \$11,206,215 for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$43,283,124.

KEY FEATURES SUMMARY

- This action amends the contract with HDR Engineering, Inc. activating the design-build procurement support option under Phase 3 work for the Federal Way Link Extension.
- Design-build procurement support activities include:
 - Development of procurement documents for a design-build contract from the Angle Lake Station to the Federal Way Transit Center;
 - Preparation of all documentation and studies required for the acquisition of properties required for the Federal Way Link Extension alignment; and
 - Support for, environmental permitting, public outreach, and application preparation for the full funding grant agreement.
- The design-build procurement activites are expected to be complete in 2018 with the issuance of the design-build Request for Proposals (RFP).

BACKGROUND

The Federal Way Link Extension adds approximately 7.8 miles of light rail from the Angle Lake light rail station at South 200th Street in the City of SeaTac to the Federal Way City Center area in Federal Way. The extension generally parallels State Route 99 and Interstate 5, with stations at Kent/Des Moines, South 272nd, Star Lake park and ride and the Federal Way Transit Center. New parking structures will be constructed at each of the three stations. Notice to proceed for the design-build contract is anticipated in early 2019 and the project is scheduled to open for service in 2024.

The Final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) was published on November 18, 2016 in compliance with the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) and the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). On January 26, 2017, the Sound Transit Board selected the route, profile, station and associated infrastructure to be built for the Federal Way Link Extension. In early March 2017, Sound Transit received the signed Federal Way Link Extension Record of Decisions from the Federal Transit Administration and Federal Highway Administration.

As part of the design-build procurement method, Sound Transit will work closely with key stakeholders and permitting jurisdictions to identify project requirements to be included in the design-build RFP. This work will effectively continue to advance the project's preliminary engineering until the design-build contract is awarded in early 2019.

Sound Transit will submit the application for entry into the Engineering phase in late 2017. Precertification activities are currently underway and property acquisition activities are scheduled to begin in 2Q 2017.

The Federal Way Link Extension has completed Phase 1 - alternatives analysis and environmental scoping, and Phase 2 - preparation of a Draft EIS and conceptual engineering of alternative alignments and stations. Moreover, portions of Phase 3 are complete including the preparation of a Final EIS.

In 2017, HDR was invited to negotiate the optional scope of work and cost for design-build procurement support. The scope of work includes support for right-of-way acquisition.

FISCAL IMPACT

This action is within the authorized project allocation to date and sufficient funds remain after approval of this action to fund the anticipated remaining work in the preliminary engineering and the right of way phases as contained in the current cost estimates.

The authorized project allocation to date for the Federal Way Link Extension is \$412,625,000.

Preliminary Engineering Phase

Within the preliminary engineering phase, \$39,755,211 has been allocated to the budget line item for civil preliminary engineering work. The proposed action would commit \$7,641,521 to this line item and leaves a remaining budget balance of \$11,725.

Right of Way Phase

Within the the right of way phase, \$41,569,812 has been allocated to the budget line item for ROW Administration work. The proposed action would commit \$3,564,694 to this line item and leave a remaining budget balance of \$36,800,214.
