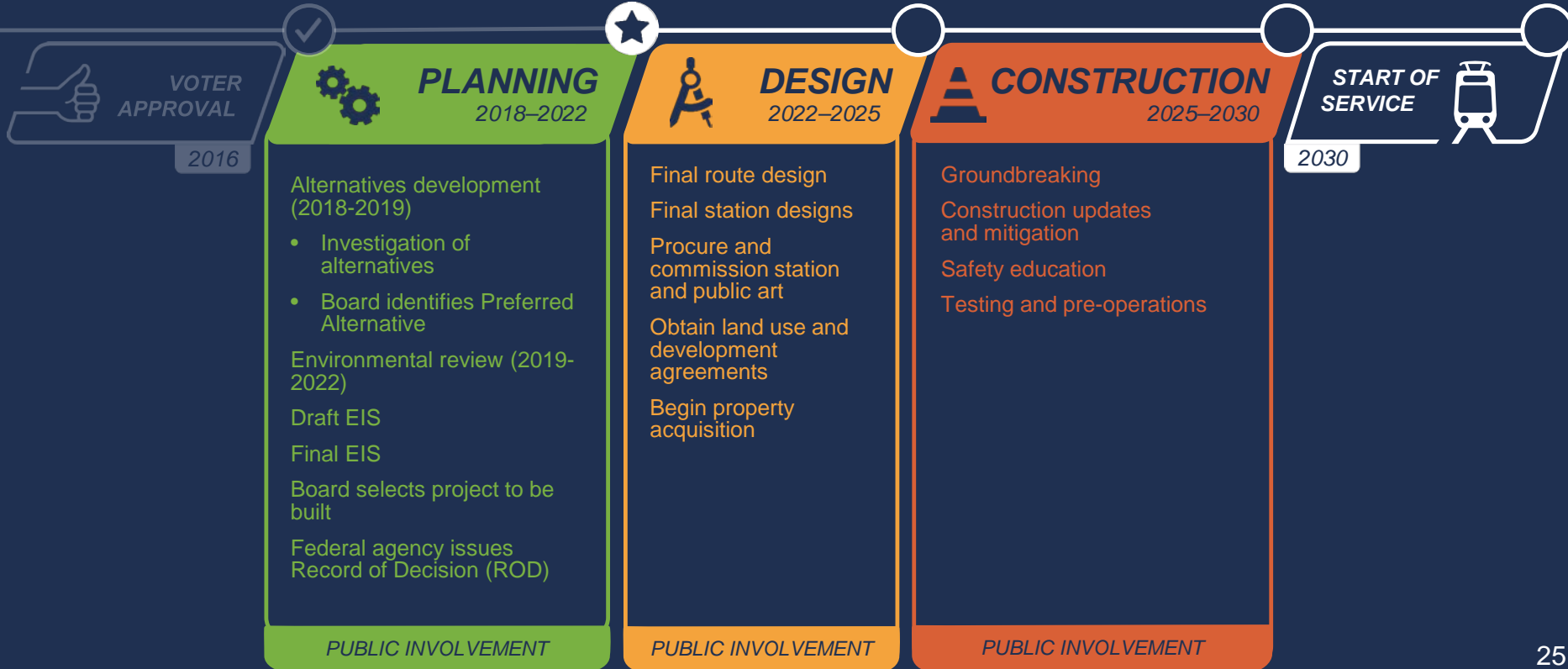
# Tacoma Dome Link Extension

## Federal Way Transit Center to Tacoma Dome

- **Length:** 9.7 miles
- **Stations:** 4 (2 parking garages)
- **Daily Project Riders:** 27,000-37,000 (2040)

- Apply innovative ideas and lessons learned to streamline project delivery



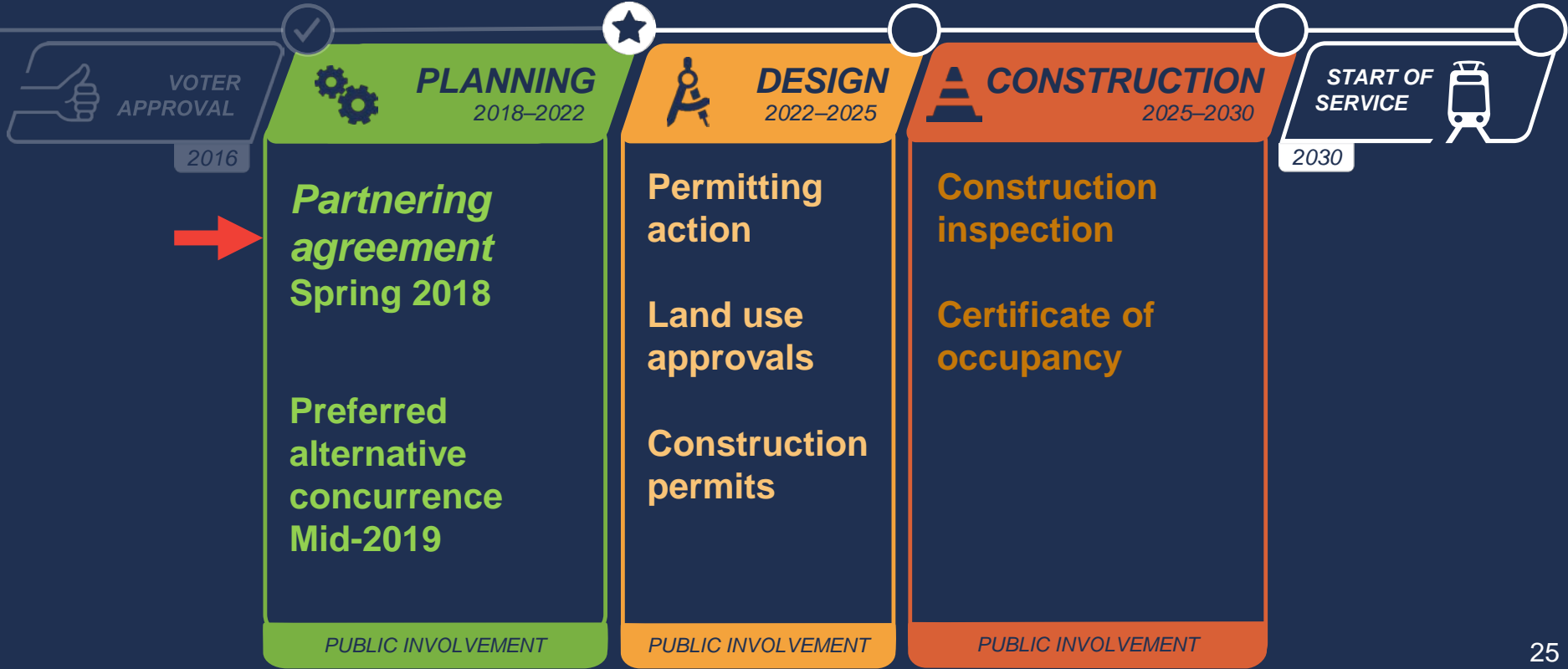
# *Partnering Agreements*

- Agreements include commitments on:
  - Collaborative community engagement to build consensus
  - Shared environmental review documents
  - Streamlined permit review and processing
  - Assign designated representatives from each agency to the project
- Separate agreements between corridor jurisdictions (spring 2018)
- Examining a potential agreement with the Puyallup Tribe of Indians
