PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a partnership agreement and initial task order with King County Metro to provide project development support services in the amount of \$860,000, with a 10% contingency of \$86,000 for a total authorized amount not to exceed \$946,000.

KEY FEATURES SUMMARY

- This action funds two FTEs during the 2018-19 biennium to provide service integration and capital facility planning support during the alternatives development, evaluation and preferred alternative identification phases of the projects identified in the Sound Transit 3 (ST3) Plan.
- Enables King County Metro (KCM) to commit and provide regular, timely and coordinated support for Sound Transit projects, strengthening intermodal integration and facility design during early project development and minimizing later changes during design and construction.
- Includes options to add tasks, budget and duration, per agreement and approval of both parties.
- King County Metro will provide project management and additional staff support at their cost.

BACKGROUND

Achieving seamless intermodal integration is a core goal of both Sound Transit's and KCM's facility planning and service delivery to the public. The ST3 program has increased the need for KCM participation in Sound Transit's project development activities. However, KCM has its own ambitious system expansion plans and does not have enough staff resources to support both their own program and Sound Transit's expansion needs. Past experience suggests that having KCM staff dedicated to Sound Transit projects early in project development improves intermodal integration. Regular, timely and coordinated participation by KCM earlier in Sound Transit's project development is expected to lead to better and more durable transit integration decisions, and reduce the risks of later changes that negatively impact Sound Transit project costs and schedules.

FISCAL INFORMATION

This action is within the authorized project allocation to date and sufficient funds remain after approval of this action to fund the anticipated remaining work in the preliminary engineering phase as contained in the current cost estimates.

The authorized project allocation to date for the ST3 Planning is \$52,648,024. Within that amount, \$47,631,973 has been set aside in the preliminary engineering phase. The proposed action would commit an additional \$946,000 to this phase, leaving a remaining uncommitted balance of \$28,011,075.
