### Construction and Maintenance Agreement and Real Property Rights Acquisition at 7th Street NW Grade Crossing for the Puyallup Station Parking and Access Improvements Project

### Proposed action

Authorizes the chief executive officer to (1) execute Construction and Maintenance Agreement with the BNSF Railway Company and the City of Puyallup; and (2) to obtain real property rights at the 7th Street NW grade crossing in the City of Puyallup for the Puyallup Station Parking and Access Improvements project for an amount not to exceed \$743,691 with a 10 percent contingency of \$74,369 for a total authorized amount not to exceed \$818,060.

### Key features summary

- The improvements to the existing 7th Street NW railroad grade crossing in the City of Puyallup are part of the new signalization of the 7<sup>th</sup> Street NW/W Stewart Avenue intersection required by the Determination of Non-significance resulting from the Environmental Phase of the project.
- The proposed Construction and Maintenance Agreement with the BNSF Railway Corporation (BNSF) would provide for:
  - Sound Transit to construct improvements to the existing 7th Street NW railroad grade crossing in the City of Puyallup as part of the Puyallup Station Parking and Access Improvements project;
  - Acquisition of temporary construction easements to construct the proposed improvements at the existing 7th street NW railroad crossing.
  - Transfer improvements constructed by Sound Transit and property rights acquired from BNSF to the City of Puyallup to own and maintain following completion of the project.
- Sound Transit's design build contractor, Hensel Phelps Construction Co., will design and construct the road and civil related crossing improvements as part of their design build contract which was awarded in December 2019.
- Sound Transit will reimburse BNSF for design review, final connection to BNSF's system, and any crossing equipment that may need to be relocated due to the design.

### Background

In November 2008, the voter approved ST2 Plan included funding for access improvements to the Puyallup Sounder Station. During the process of refining the projects included in the ST2 plan, the Sound Transit Board responded to community concerns by calling for a Sounder Access and Demand Study. The study evaluated potential access improvements to eight existing Sounder stations including Puyallup. The study provided a range of potential access improvement projects that Sound Transit could

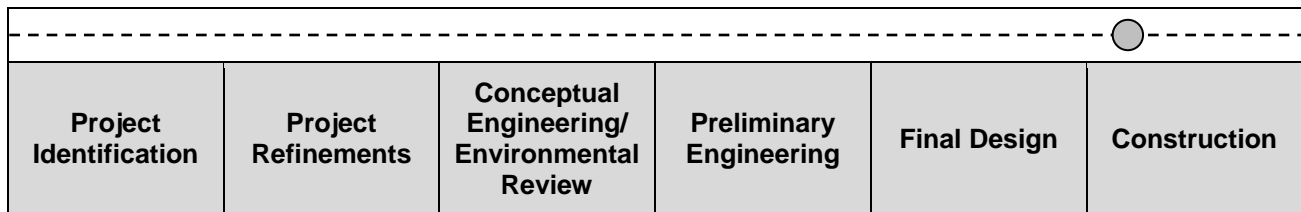
implement in full or in part, that would allow riders to use alternative modes of travel to the Puyallup Station.

The project builds on the results of the Sounder Station Access and Demand Study. The initial phase of the project evaluated parking, traffic, pedestrian, and bicycle access improvements that could be made to improve rider access to the Puyallup Sounder Station.

Sound Transit issued a Determination of Non-significance under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) on February 17, 2016. The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) concurred that the Project qualified as a categorical exclusion as described in its National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Rules. On April 28, 2016, the Sound Transit Board selected the project to be built through Resolution No. R2016-07.

In December 2019, through Motion No. M2019-110, the Sound Transit Board provided authorization for the chief executive officer to award the contract to the highest scoring design-build contractor. Notice to Proceed was issued to Hensel Phelps on March 26, 2020.

**Fiscal information**

This action is within the baseline budget and sufficient monies remain after approval of this action to fund the remaining work in the construction and right of way phases.

The baseline budget for the Puyallup Station Parking and Access Improvements project is \$79,100,000. The action with BNSF Railway Company and the City of Puyallup for \$818,060 includes spending in two separate phases.

Within the construction phase, \$1,750,000 has been set aside in the budget line item for BNSF Railway Company. The action would commit an additional \$785,369 to this line item and leave a budget balance of \$143,036.

Within the right of way phase, \$4,063,000 has been set aside in the budget line item for Right of Way Acquisition. The action would commit an additional \$32,691 to this line item and leave a budget balance of \$26,020.

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
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**Motion**
