Proposed action

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a Project Administration Agreement with the City of Everett for the Everett Link Extension and OMF North project.

Key features summary

- The Everett Link Extension and OMF North project will expand Link light rail service to the City of Everett. City involvement in project planning is critical to the successful and timely delivery of the project.
- In 2023, the Board approved Motion No. M2023-14 authorizing a Partnering Agreement with the City of Everett, the City of Lynnwood, Snohomish County, Community Transit and Sound Transit to document and confirm a mutual understanding of general terms and conditions to advance the implementation of the Project.
- This action would authorize a Project Administration Agreement to address the commitment in the Partnering Agreement for the Parties to negotiate an agreement to provide reimbursement to the City for the costs of certain services and products related to the project.
- Following execution of a Project Administration Agreement with the City, the parties will execute one or more task orders consistent with the agreement, up to a total value that shall not exceed the CEO's delegated signature authority of \$10,000,000.
- The Everett City Council approved the execution of this agreement on 1/31/2024.

Background

The Everett Link Extension (EVLE) and Operations and Maintenance Facility (OMF) North project is part of the ST3 Plan, funding for which was approved by voters in 2016. The EVLE ST3 representative alignment extends Link light rail transit approximately 16 miles from Lynnwood City Center station to Everett Station. The representative project includes six stations; one unfunded provisional station; two parking facilities; OMF North; and allowances for system access, sustainability, and transit-oriented development. The Board adopted target schedule for the project is 2037; the affordable schedule is 2037 to SW Everett Industrial Center and 2041 to Everett Station, with an affordability gap of \$500 million in 2022\$.

In June of 2023, after completion of the alternatives development phase of the project and a public scoping period, the Board identified preferred alternative(s) and other alternatives to be studied in a Draft Environmental Impact Statement.

In August of 2023, the City of Everett, the City of Lynnwood, Snohomish County, Community Transit and Sound Transit executed a Partnering Agreement for the Project, following Board approval of Motion M2023-14 in February of 2023.

The Project Administration Agreement with the City addresses the commitment in Section 23 of the Partnering Agreement for the Parties to work cooperatively to establish an agreement to provide reimbursement to the City for costs of certain services and products related to the Project. The Sound Transit partnering process with the City is consistent with the System Expansion Implementation Plan. The agreement has been reviewed and recommended by Sound Transit and City staff.

Following execution of a Project Administration Agreement with the City, the parties will execute one or more task orders, the total value of which shall not exceed the CEO's \$10,000,000 delegated signature authority.

Fiscal information
